Antonina Astone, Ph.D. – is an associate professor of private law, albeit qualified for the functions of full professor, in the Department of Political and Juridical Sciences of the University of Messina, and is also a lawyer admitted before the Supreme Courts. She has been a member of the Ph.D. College in *Legal Sciences* at the University of Messina since 2010, and a corresponding member of the *National Association of Italian Civilists*. Professor Astone is also a member of: the review committee of the journal *Giustizia Scuola forense Vittorio Emanuele Orlando di Roma*; the editorial board of *Diritto di Internet Digital Copyright e Data protection*; the Scientific Committee of the journal *Studia Europejskie – Studies in European Affairs*; and of the editorial board of the legal journal *Diritto Mercato Tecnologia*. Ana Bojinović Fenko, Ph.D. – is a professor of IR at the University of Ljubljana at the Faculty of Social Sciences, and teaches at all three university levels in the fields of IR and European Studies. Her areas of research are: foreign policy analysis (specifically small states, post-Yugoslav space); regionalism (particularly the Balkans and the Mediterranean); and the EU's external action (especially EU enlargement policy).

Julija Brsakoska Bazerkoska, Ph.D. – is a professor at Ss. Cyril and Methodius University, Law Faculty in Skopje, in the Republic of North Macedonia, where she teaches international relations, EU external relations law and multilateral diplomacy. She was previously engaged as a researcher under the Curriculum Research Fellowship program

Adrian Chojan, Ph.D. – is an assistant professor and researcher at both Lazarski University and the Department of European Studies of the Institute of Political Studies at the Polish Academy of Science. His research interests include: Polish foreign policy; political parties in Poland; and the Common Foreign and Security Policy of the European Union.

Antonella Correnti, Ph.D. – is a lawyer, practicing before the Supreme Court. She is a research fellow in Comparative Private Law at the University of Messina. She obtained her PhD in Comparative Private Law at the University of Palermo and was a contract professor in Comparative Private Law, in the 2016/2017 academic year, at the University of Messina.

Director of the Representation Office of the Polish Bank Association in Brussels. He is a graduate of the Faculty of Law and Administration at the University of Warsaw and the School of British and European Union Law at the University of Cambridge and the University of Warsaw. Secretary of the Court of Arbitration at the Polish Bank Association, a member of the Legal Committee of the European Banking Federation, a member of the Stakeholder Council of the European Centre at the University of Warsaw, and, finally, a member of the Team Europe Direct at the Representation in Poland of the European Commission.

Jan Hagemeyer, Ph.D. – is an associate professor at the University of Warsaw’s Faculty of Economic Science, and additionally serves as the vice president of CASE – the Center of Social and Economic Research. Previously, he has worked for the National Bank of Poland as the Chief of the Structural Analysis Division and as a research assistant at the Global Trade Analysis Project (GTAP). He is a graduate of the University of Warsaw (Ph.D., MSc. in Economics, habilitation), Purdue University (with an MA in Economics), and also studied at the London School of Economics. Péter Kacziba, Ph.D. – is a research fellow and assistant professor at the Department of Political Science and International Studies at the University of Pécs. He is currently the principal investigator of a three-year research project entitled “Conquering the Social Media? Digital Public Diplomacy in Greece and Hungary during the Covid-19 Pandemic”, supported by the National Research, Development, and Innovation Office of Hungary. He received his Ph.D. in political science in 2017, and his habilitation in 2024. His research interests include public diplomacy, digital diplomacy, and foreign policy studies in Southeast Europe.

Galyna Myskiv – is a doctor of economics (Dr Hab.), and a professor at the Marketing and Logistics Department at Lviv Polytechnic National University. She serves as the guarantor of the Internet Marketing educational program within the 075 Marketing specialisation at the second (Master's) level of education. She is the author of more than 200 scientific and educational-methodical works, and is also a supervisor of postgraduates. Her scientific interests include research on sustainable development issues, marketing communication policy, the development of supply chain logistics, the monetary policy of the state, and social responsibility of business, among others.

Leokadia Oręziak – is a full professor of economics, and head of the Department of International Finance at the SGH Warsaw School of Economics. Iryna Pasinowych, Ph.D. – is an associate professor at the Management and International Entrepreneurship Department at Lviv Polytechnic National University. She is the author of over 70 scientific works. She has completed internships within the academic mobility program ERASMUS+ (Yaroslav, Poland) and at the Institute of Economics and Finance of the University of Technology (Zhezhuv, Poland). Her research interests include state economic policy, financial analysis, sustainable development, and corporate social responsibility.

Beata Przybylska-Maszner, Ph.D. – is a political scientist and Europeanist. Since 2016, she has been an associate professor at the Department for European Integration Research of the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism at the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań, Poland. the Scientific Advisory Committee to the Financial Ombudsman and the Competition Chapter of the Financial Ombudsman Award for the best Doctoral, Master's, Bachelor's and Postgraduate theses in the field of customer protection in the financial market (2023–2026); a member of the Committee on Banking Ethics at the Polish Bank Association (2023–2026); and, finally, Chairperson of the Council of the FORKON Forum of Consumer Organisations.

Anna Wójtowicz, Ph.D. – is an assistant professor at the Jean Monnet Chair of the European Union at the SGH Warsaw School of Economics. Her research interests include EU policy, with a particular focus on energy policy, the methods and ways of lobbying EU institutions, renewable energy development, and EU energy security, and is the author and co-author of numerous publications in this field. She is a board member of the Polish European Community Studies Association (PECSA), and is an active member of the Polish Industrial Lobby (PLP).
