Evita Dionysiou – Ph.D. in International Economic Law & EU Law, and has extensive teaching experience at all academic levels. She is a Professor of EU Law at the Hellenic Police Academy (a University-level institution) and a member of the Associated Teaching Staff at the Law School of Neapolis University Pafos (LLM “International and European Business Law”). She also holds the position of Unit Leader & Lecturer at the Law School and the Maritime Business School of Metropolitan College, where she teaches several courses in collaboration with Oxford Brookes University and Southampton Solent University. Currently, she is a Member of the Editorial Board of two international academic journals. In the past, she has served as a Lecturer in Common Commercial Policy of the EU at Panteion University of Athens, as a Study Counsellor at Panteion University of Athens (Postgraduate Programme “International and European Studies”), and as Head of Research of the European Documentation Center of Panteion University of Athens. Her teaching/research interests include: EU Law, EU Policies and Institutions, the EU’s Internal Market, European Integration, the EU’s External Relations, EU Trade Relations, the EU as a Global Actor, International Economic Law, and International Trade/Transatlantic Trade.
